



Caution!!! <u>Never</u> work on a hot exhaust system. Serious injury in the form of burns can result If the vehicle has been in use and the exhaust system is hot, allow vehicle to cool for at least 1 hour. Always wear eye protection when working under any vehicle.

Note: It is our recommendation that you use a hoist or hydraulic lift to facilitate the installation of your new Borla Performance Exhaust System.

Taking all under car safety precautions, lift the vehicle using a hoist or hydraulic lift. Once this has been done, you may begin the removal of your old exhaust system from your vehicle.

Note: Before removing the original exhaust system from your vehicle, please compare the parts you have received with the bill of materials provided on the previous page to assure that you have all the parts necessary for the installation of your new Borla Performance Exhaust System.

Note: With a used vehicle, we suggest a penetrating spray lubricant to be applied liberally to all exhaust fasteners and allowing a significant period of time for the chemical to lubricate the threads before attempting to disassemble.

## **Original Exhaust System Removal**


- 1. Left Side and Right Side factory muffler tubing must be cut prior to installation. (See Fig. 1)
- Sections of factory tubing is flattened for exhaust clearance below rear sub-frame. Begin with Left Side tube and locate intersection of round section and flattened area. Measure and mark cutting line 4-3/8" as shown. Cut tubing with metal-cutting bladed saw. (See Fig. 2A)
- Repeat Step 2 for Right Side tube and locate intersection of round section and flattened area. Measure and mark cutting line 4-3/8" as shown. (See Fig. 2A)
- On Left Side locate and remove (2) nuts on Hanger Bracket and remove hanger from bracket. <u>Keep Hanger Bracket and hardware for reinstallation</u>. Remove Vacuum Hose connected to Left Side Electronic Actuator. (See Fig 3)
- 5. Repeat STEP 4 for Right Side Hanger and Vacuum Hose.
- 6. Support muffler assembly with stand. Carefully remove hangers from rubber isolators and remove factory rear muffler assembly from vehicle.
- 7. Deburr sharp edges of cut tubing on vehicle. (See Fig. 4)

WARNING: Use extreme caution during installation. Torque all fasteners according to manufacturer's torque values and tightening sequence. <u>DO NOT</u> use air impact tools to tighten fasteners on Borla Performance Exhaust Systems. Use of such tools may result in bent flanges or gasket contact areas leading to exhaust leaks.

NOTE: When you first start your vehicle after the installation of your new Borla Performance Exhaust System, there may be some smoke and fumes coming from the system. This is a protective oil based coating used in the manufacturing of mandrel bent performance exhaust tubing. This is not a problem and will disappear within a very short period of time after the exhaust has reached normal operating temperatures.

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## PRE-ASSEMBLY FOR 11924 & 11925 ONLY L/S Tail Pipe Assembly R/S Tail Pipe Assembly

- 1. Place a clamp on the expanded edge of the L/S Tip Assembly and place over the newly cut tube. (See Figs. A & B) <u>DO NOT TIGHTEN THE CLAMP BOLT.</u>
- 2. Repeat STEP 1 for the **R/S Tip Assembly**.
- Transfer both factory electronic actuators from factory exhaust to L/S Tip Assembly and R/S Tip Assembly using factory hardware. Tighten bolts 8 ft. lbs. (See Fig. C)







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
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# **Borla Performance Exhaust Installation**

- Starting on Left Side, place a clamp on expanded end of L/H Muffler Assembly. Carefully insert (2) hangers into rubber isolators. <u>DO NOT TIGHTEN CLAMP</u> <u>BOLTS</u> (See Figs. 5A & 5B)
- 2. Repeat Step 1 to install **R/S Muffler Assembly** to vehicle.
- 3. Reinstall L/S Muffler Assembly to vehicle using factory Left Side Hanger Bracket using factory hardware. Tighten nuts to 12 ft. lbs. (See Figs. 6A & 6B)
- 4. Repeat Step 3 to reinstall factory R/S Muffler Assembly to vehicle.
- 5. <u>11924, 11925 ONLY:</u> Reconnect left-side and right-side wire harness to factory electronic actuators.
- 6. Check your exhaust system for proper clearance under the vehicle and also for tip centering to valence. (See Fig. 7)
- 7. Once position has been determined to be correct, tighten the Muffler Assembly inlet clamp bolts; then the Tailpipe Assembly Tip clamp bolts, 32-35 ft. lbs. (See Fig. 8)
- 8. Before starting your vehicle, make sure to check all wires, hoses, brake lines, body parts and tires for safe clearance from the exhaust system.
- 9. Start vehicle and check for any leaks. If any leaks are found, determine cause (such as loose or incorrectly positioned clamp) and repair as necessary.

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
